# Noh play "Chikubu-shima"

Fisherman and Dragon God: Tobiyoshi Naito, Woman and Benzaiten: Ai Ibi, Vassal: Tadasuke litomi Attendants: Tsukasa Hashimoto, Masaki Sugimoto, Shrine Priest: Nobutaka Nomura

When a vassal of the Imperial Court visits Lake Biwa on a pilgrimage to Chikubu-shima, he encounters an old man and a woman. Together, they head to the island on a fishing boat. The vassal points out that women are traditionally forbidden from setting foot on the island, but the old man explains that Chikubu-shima enshrines Benzaiten, a female deity, and therefore does not exclude women. With that, the old man and the woman vanish. Soon after, Benzaiten and the Dragon God appear...

The story is set on Chikubu-shima, an island on Lake Biwa that is also a famous tourist destination. The chants evoking the lake's springtime scenery and the graceful dances of the gods are key highlights of the performance.
